

KOBE JAPANESE PROGRAM January 2024 Explore Kobe and discover its links to Oceania!

5th - 26th January 2024 *in-person

The Kobe Japanese Program (KJP) January 2024 is designed for undergraduate or graduate students with upper elementary Japanese language skills.

The focus of the course is Japanese Language and Area Studies, including culture and society, based on the Kobe/Hyogo area and its links to Oceania.

The course will be conducted *in-person, including offcampus activities.

*Please note that some parts of the program might be conducted online depending on the situation.

Requirements:

- Undergraduate or graduate students enrolled in Universities of Australia or New Zealand
- Level: Upper Elementary, completed Genki 1 level or equivalent
- Bring your computer or tablet to access digital course materials and for preparation of the final presentation

CONTENT & HOURS

1. JAPANESE LANGUAGE <36 hours>

3hr Class × 12 days

The course will review grammar and vocabulary from Genki 1 level, and introduce new grammar points from Genki 2. Students will begin preparing for the final presentation in the latter half of the course.

Classes will be conducted 9:10~12:30AM by native Japanese instructors. With small class numbers, we promote highly communicative, hands-on learning.

Practical conversation

- Introduction of important daily life vocabulary
- Texts related to area studies
- Preparation leading up to presentation

2. AREA STUDIES <12 hours>

2-4hr Session × 4 days

Focusing on Kobe City and Hyogo prefecture, students will gain insight into Japanese culture, industry & society.

Classes will take place outside the classroom, each session featuring a real-time Q&A session.

- ♦ Guest lectures
- Topic examples (subject to change): Kobe City, Himeji Castel, Local Sake Brewery

3. EXTRACURRICULAR

The program offers chances for interaction with local Kobe university students outside of class.

- The fee includes meal plans: breakfast and dinner except Sundays and national holidays.
- (Fémale) International House: Kobe University dormitory Utility bills 400 JPY per day is required. Meal plans are NOT available.
- It takes approximately 40-50 minutes from either accommodation to the university.
