Lesson topic

This class aims to improve skills of Japanese composition for advanced level students; develop fundamental skills of Japanese composition for academic papers and documents.

Lesson target

1. To be able to use appropriate style and expressions for academic papers.
2. To be able to understand the fundamental structures of academic papers.

Syllabus and plan

Students will learn the basic rule of academic writing and frequently used vocabulary and grammatical expressions in academic articles through practicing.

Class 2 (4/23) Style and words of academic writing

Class 3 (4/30) Paraphrase

Class 6 (5/28) Expressions for presenting charts and describing changes

Class 7 (6/4) Expressions for analyzing causes

Class 8 (The schedule will be presented in class) Expressions of conclusion, Feedback

Evaluation method

Students will be assessed on the following three viewpoints.

1. Class participation 30%
2. Homework 30%
3. Task(1 and 2) 40%

*70% minimum attendance is required for evaluation; those who fail to meet this mandatory requirement will be automatically graded "F"(fail).

Evaluation baseline

1. Class participation will be assessed based on student's attitude and engagement in class activities, as well as level of completion of assigned task.
2. Homework will be assessed on rate of submission and quality (whether the student meets the criteria, whether they are able to apply what was learned in class).
3. Tasks will be assessed whether based on the contents the student studied in class and complete the task with appropriate structure, word, expression, and contents.

This is an advanced level Japanese course. Students who wish to register for this course must have completed Japanese course for the upper intermediate level or obtained the "Advanced Level" score in the GEC-JTest. Exchange students (special auditing students) can register for this course.

Related classes:

Review and preparation

Do the homework indicated in class by the due date. Auditors also are required to submit all assignments and participate in class activities.
