Lesson topic

This class aims to improve comprehensive Japanese skills (4 skills) for beginner level students.

Lesson target

1. To be able to write and read Hiragana and Katakana (Kanji is not included).
2. To be able to understand the elementary structure of Japanese.
3. To be able to talk about topics related to everyday situations and yourself with sentence patterns, vocabulary and basic expressions at beginner level.

Syllabus and plan

Students will complete the assigned textbook across the Introductory Japanese I~III courses, completing 1 lesson across the 3 scheduled classes per week. While students are permitted to attend courses individually, it is highly recommended to attend all three courses in succession for most effective academic results.

The objective of each class is as follows. The primary focus of this class (Introductory Japanese I) is on B) :
A) Learning sentence patterns, B) Learning and practicing spoken expressions, C) Comprehension and overall learning.

The class schedule is as follows:

- Class 1 (6/15): Lesson 8
- Class 2 (6/22): Lesson 9
- Class 3 (6/29): Lesson 10
- Class 4 (7/6): Lesson 11
- Class 5 (7/13): Lesson 12
- Class 6 (7/22): Lesson 13
- Class 7 (7/27): Review and final examination
- Class 8 (8/3): Task based assignment

8 classes (15 hours)

*Introductory Japanese I B-III B: 3 classes per week for 8 weeks (45 hours at total per quarter)

Evaluation method

Students will be assessed on participation and performance in class, assignment and the final examination.

1. Class participation and performance in class 30%
2. Assignments 30% (Homework, Q&A Dictation)
3. Final examination 40%

- ・ Assignments will be indicated in class
- ・ 70% minimum attendance is required for evaluation; those who fail to meet this mandatory requirement will be automatically graded "F"(fail).

Evaluation baseline

1. Class participation and performance in class: Students are evaluated whether do practices and tasks that teacher conduct in class, and communicate with class participants through the those activities.
2. Assignment: Students are evaluated whether do assignment and every day's homework properly and submit them by the due date.
3. Final examination: Examination based on the textbooks. Students are evaluated whether understand and use sentence patterns, vocabulary and conversation expressions.

Students who have no or little experience of learning Japanese.

Exchange students (special auditing students) can register for this course.

Auditors also are required to submit all assignments and participate in class activities and inform your teacher in advance when you are absent from class.

1. It is strongly recommended to take "Introductory Japanese IA-III A". If you cannot take all the class of "Introductory Japanese IA-III A", it is recommended for students to catch up by individual study.

- It is recommended to check the lesson contents of the textbooks in advance.

Review for the class:

· Students are required to do homework (assignment) and submit it by due date. Even if students can't attend the class, it is required to do and submit the homework according to class schedule. We will explain the homework in class.

· For effective language study, it is recommended for students to review every lesson. We will recommend materials for reviewing in class.
