Lesson topic

This class aims to improve comprehensive Japanese skills (4 skills) for beginner level students.

Lesson target

1. To be able to write and read Hiragana and Katakana (Kanji is not included).
2. To be able to understand the elementary structure of Japanese.
3. To be able to talk about topics related to everyday situations and yourself with sentence patterns, vocabulary and basic expressions at beginner level.

Syllabus and plan

In Introductory Japanese I to III, Students use the textbook "Minna no Nihongo" and study one lesson in three classes per week. While students are permitted to attend courses individually, it is highly recommended to attend all three courses in succession for most effective academic results.

The objective of each class is as follows. The primary focus of this class is on A:

A) Learning sentence patterns, B) Learning and practicing spoken expressions, C) Comprehension and overall learning.

The class schedule is as follows:

- Class1 (6/12) : Lesson 8
- Class2 (6/19) : Lesson 9
- Class3 (6/26) : Lesson 10
- Class4 (7/3) : Lesson 11
- Class5 (7/10) : Lesson 12
- Class6 (7/17) : Lesson 13
- Class7 (7/24) : Review and final examination
- Class8 (7/31) : Task based assignment

8 classes (15 hours)

*Introductory Japanese IB-IIIB: 3 classes per week for 8 weeks (45 hours at total per quarter)

Evaluation method

Evaluation components:

1. Class participation 30%
2. Assignments 30%
3. The final test 40%

* Assignments will be indicated in class

* 70% minimum attendance is required for evaluation; those who fail to meet this mandatory requirement will be automatically graded "F"(fail).

Evaluation baseline

Class participation will be assessed based on student' s attitude and engagement in class activities, as well as level of completion of assigned tasks.

Assignments will be assessed based on rate of submission and quality (whether the student meets the criteria, whether they are able to apply what was learned in class).

The final test will assess the student' s understanding of class or assignment content.

Target students:

Students who have no or little experience of learning Japanese.

Exchange students (special auditing students) can register for this course.

Notes:

Auditors also are required to submit all assignments and participate in class activities and inform your teacher in advance when you are absent from class.

Related classes:

1. It is strongly recommended to take "Introductory Japanese IB-IIIB". If you cannot take "Introductory Japanese IB-IIIB", it is recommended for students to catch up by individual study.
2. Before taking this class, it is recommended to take "Introductory Japanese IA-IIIA".

Preparation for the class:

- Please obtain the textbooks before the class begins (see below).
- This class is conducted upon the assumption that students will spend time to prepare for class. Students are required to watch the preparation video before each class.

Review for the class:

- Students are required to do homework (assignment) and submit it by due date. Even if students can't attend the class, it required to do and submit the homework according to class schedule. We will explain the homework in class.
- For effective language study, it is recommended for students to review every lesson. We will recommend materials for reviewing in class.
